PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Michelle Hocking President

It is with pride and excitement that I reflect on the progress and many achievements of the past year as we delivered, promoted and invested in basketball to make it a leading community sport in the ACT.

We forged new partnerships, increased our community engagement, celebrated significant achievements and laid the groundwork for a bright and promising future.

Our 75th anniversary dinner brought together past and present members, to commemorate our rich history and achievements. This milestone event was not only a celebration but an opportunity to recognize and honour those who contributed to our journey. The stories shared on the night will be cherished for years to come.

We continued to advocate for basketball facilities to meet our growing needs. This year we had a huge win, with an ACT Government Budget commitment of almost \$1million for the planning and design phase of the Belconnen Basketball Stadium expansion. As well, we worked across the ACT government, to secure increased access (and facility improvements) to school courts for our community clubs, and BACT participation and development programs.

We made a significant financial investment into our aging facility at Belconnen, replacing the floors on Court 1 and 2, and undertook much needed maintenance and repairs across the stadium that are typical of a 30+year venue.

Our commitment to recognise, value and celebrate diversity was reinforced as we entered a Memorandum of Understanding with the South Sudanese Eagles Basketball opening up new opportunities and strengthening our ties with the community.

We partnered with Warriors Basketball Club to deliver the biggest NAIDOC tournament to date, celebrating Indigenous culture and the contribution the indigenous community make to our sport.

We highlighted female participation and hosted our first Women's Leadership Breakfast. The keynote speakers shared their experiences and insights on leadership and resilience inspiring those in attendance. Our All- Abilities programs expanded as we introduced new participation and school initiatives for People with Intellectual Disability and wheelchair programs, increasing access to many new participants. We supported our young referees through the Green Whistle Program for U18s. This program is aimed at protecting young referees and reducing in game abuse. We will continue to expand our efforts to provide a safe and inclusive environment for all in our community.

Our local competitions were (and still are) bursting at the seams. The year culminated in a highly competitive and huge finals weekend which saw many people through the doors, outstanding basketball and the very best of our community on display.

Obviously, basketball is reflective of the broader community we habitate, and challenges such as increased reports of poor behaviour, rising costs, higher community expectations and stretched facilities and resources impacted us, just as it did others. We will continue to respond and address these to strengthen and keep growing our community.

We cannot achieve any of the above without collective effort.

Our clubs and volunteers are instrumental in our success. Thank you for your dedication, passion and commitment. Your contributions have a significant impact on our community, and we sincerely appreciate your hard work.

To the BACT management and staff, Nicole and team, who work tirelessly to deliver our sport in the ACT. Thank you for your professionalism, responsiveness and willingness to go the extra mile and for always looking for opportunity to learn, improve and innovate to keep basketball at the forefront.

I would like to acknowledge and thank Kath Toohey for her contributions to the Board and basketball community. During her tenure Kath has made a significant contribution to BACT supporting and driving strong governance of the organisation. And to the Board for ensuring that the right checks and balances are in place, the organisation is resourced to meet the demands of today and strategically positioned for the challenges of the future.

As we reflect on the past year, Basketball ACT has continued to grow and achieve success both on and off the court. Our commitment to excellence, integrity, and community engagement has strengthened our position as a leading sporting organisation in the region. Our vision of sustainable growth of the community involved in basketball by 100% by 2029 continues to take strong steps having recorded 19% growth in the basketball community between 2022 – 2024 (note this number includes both on and off court participants, fans and supporters).

In 2024 BACT completed a self-assessment against the Australian Sports Commission Sports Governance Principles. Overall BACT demonstrated we are excelling across the area of Governance and are developed in Financial Management categories for a sporting organisation. From this assessment the following key actions will be undertaken in 2025 – review of the BACT Constitution against modern governance standards, review the Board Charter and code of conduct in conjunction with organisational policies to ensure alignment of values and the establishment of multiyear financial projections in relation to budgets and cash flows.

We invested in our people, providing opportunities to build capability through the many coaching and referee courses and education activities held throughout the year, as well as bringing a governance expert in to provide training to Member Clubs and their Committee Members.

We utilised technology to increase community engagement. We ramped up our social media presence and launched Glory League, a new automated video system. The feedback from our community has been overwhelmingly positive. The Basketball ACT app was released providing our NBL1 fans with up-to-date information and an interactive online experience as well as providing a resource platform for our coaches.

We celebrated as our Nationals Academy team and Canberra Gunners Wheelchair team won their respective Waratah competitions. The Nationals and Gunners reached the finals of NBL1 East while the Gunners Academy fell just short of a Waratah finals spot.

The Canberra Gunners and Nationals were the most watched Association in the NBL1 East competition for the 2024 season. The dedication and hard work of our athletes, coaches and officials paid off, and we couldn't be prouder of their achievements.

FACILITIES REPORT

In 2024 BACT competitions were played across eleven (11) competition courts catering to the delivery of over 10,000 games of basketball for 15,000 playing members. Stretching games and trainings to be played late at night and early mornings. Schools and community courts / gyms continue to be utilised but remain a challenge to cater for the growing needs of the community despite some mild increases in additional facilities from these sectors over recent years.

Basketball ACT (BACT) has been actively working to address the increasing demand for basketball facilities in the Canberra region. Currently BACT and Member Clubs are at a point where additional games are extremely hard to find courts and clubs have had to turn away participants due to capacity constraints.

BACT signed a Heads of Agreement (HoA) with the ACT Government in the last financial year in respect to expanding the Southern side of the existing facility in Belconnen with an additional three courts. The ACT Government announced \$938,000 in funding for the 2024–25 financial year. This money is for ACT Sports and Recreation to utilise for preliminary work towards the expansion of the Belconnen Stadium. This will include a condition audit of the existing facility, environmental impact study and some design and planning work.

In April 2024, BACT invested \$362,000 into the replacement of the court flooring on courts 1 and 2 at the Belconnen Basketball Stadium. A FIBA Level 1 certified KTL FlexiPro 12 V3 + solid parquet flooring system was installed on top of the existing court system, which will revive the life and suitability of the playing surface for another 30 years.

Whilst the stadium has been well maintained, the ageing facilities will require ongoing maintenance and replacement of core infrastructure over the coming years to ensure that the stadium continues to provide facilities that meet the required standards. Additional investment in the current stadium as part of this maintenance program will be required to continue over the short term.

BACT's Strategic pillar to provide fit for purpose facilities at all levels of basketball to cater for both the current and future requirements of the basketball community, has taken a positive step forward throughout 2024 and we look forward to further milestones in the Belconnen Stadium expansion to continue this journey.

TECHNOLOGY PARTNERS

In 2024, Basketball ACT worked with several providers to adopt new platforms and apps designed to our provide members, with a greater ability to manage game information, registration, and connectivity. Apps and Programs adopted included:



BACT, procured Glory League to provide fully automated video system to all players across all competitions. The video system, installed at the Belconnen and Tuggeranong venues links to the competition management platform (PlayHQ) and provides post-game video links to individual team members and coaches, allowing them to view their games, collect statistics and share content.



In 2024, BACT, in partnership with Play HQ, introduced competition app MY HOOPS, for participants to keep abreast of competition news, results, draws and statistics. MY HOOPS also incorporates realtime updates for game cancellations, rescheduling or forfeits, which allows teams and team coordinators, to ensure information sharing is shared quickly, amongst participants.



The official BACT app for the Canberra Gunners and Nationals, powered by Tiparra was launched in 2024. The app allows you to receive notifications during games, find tickets and buy merchandise. Whilst taking part in competitions and giveaways. Work has commenced with Tiparra to expand the app content for coaches and technical officials assisting in resources and education for all levels.

FINANCE REPORT

For the year ending 30 September 2024, Basketball ACT (BACT) reports a deficit of \$212,868 on total revenue of \$4,606,108 and net assets of \$7,382,991.

Total Revenue for the 2024 financial year of \$4,606,108 (2023: \$4,436,819) represents an increase of 3.82%. Competitions revenue of \$2,949,146 in 2024 represented approximately 64% of total revenue (2023: 60%).

Development Revenue from U12/U14 Canberra Basketball programs have been reallocated to the Performance department in line with how the programs are currently structured hence a decrease from the previous year (30.4%). Despite this reallocation, Performance Revenue only increased by 15.3%. Development Revenue as whole decreased due to factors already highlighted in the participation report (i.e. low school clinic programs etc).

Total expenditure for the 2024 financial year was \$4,819,278 (2023: \$4,437,689); an increase of 8.6%. The increase is primarily driven by employee benefits with an increased number of employed staff during the 2024 year and increased travel and court hire costs which together account for 54% of the total expenditure.

The cash position as of 30 September 2024 was \$293,184 and reflects a decrease of \$580,079 (99%) from the same time in 2023. Net Assets as of 30 September 2024 are \$7,382,991 (2023: \$7,595,859). The decreased cash balance reflects increased investment in facilities.

Whilst PKF Canberra have noted a going concern the Board and Management are confident that the Association will be able to pay its future liabilities in the ordinary course of business and have taken steps in the 2025 financial year to address this.



COMPETITIONS

The 2023/2024 year was another successful year where we continued to grow in competitions.

It was fantastic to see the growth in Winter 2024 in our girls competitions with the highest number of teams in the last 10 years, particularly in U19's where we were able to bring back a Division 4 for the first time in 8 seasons.

Our 2024 Winter Season saw the exciting introduction of Glory League across both our Junior and Senior competitions. The introduction of Glory League allows players to access footage of their entire game. Glory League uses state-of-the-art AI software that includes ball tracking and player statistics.

The Glory League features are useful to players to create highlight reels from their games, share highlight clips to those who can't make it to the games, and even vote on the Basketball ACT top 10 plays of the week.

In Juniors space we were fortunate to pick up a new venue at Radford college, the newly built Collegians Centre. With two brand new courts available to us, Radford hosted games on most Friday nights, Saturdays and Sundays.

Our school competitions were very successful in 2024 and had a large surge in team numbers, increasing by over 29% which will mean we will be able to increase the number of days we hold these competitions going forward.

As always venue space is a challenge with the continued growth across competitions. Basketball ACT continues to scout venues across the ACT, particularly in the school space.

2024 was another big year in the technical official's space, we saw growth within our referee cohort, big numbers in our courses and coverage improving each week across junior and senior competitions. The rate of growth in competitions seeing over 10,000+ domestic games creates a high workload within our official's community.

The interest in joining the Basketball ACT community as a referee was huge with 320 participants completing the community Level O referee course. Level O courses were held in conjunction with the U14 Canberra Basketball programs and Indigenous Game Development Program (IGDP) allowing participants to gain accreditation and broaden their rules knowledge.

The Willyama Performance Officiating Academy saw 10 Referee's undertake the program in 2024. Referee's selected for the program have been identified within the BACT Senior Premier League and National Championships pathway. Focusing on looking at the game from a different angle, with the group experiencing on court and off court sessions from sports specialists such as physiotherapy, psychology and nutritionist while also looking at the game from an athlete's perspective.

Fourteen Referee's were selected into the Junior Referee Development Program. The program targets Referee's beginning their representative journeys touring within the Basketball NSW Southern Junior League and BACT Performance Camp. A key focus for participants was to enhance their basic understanding of how the game is played this was achieved through game analysis and on court training.

A significant part of referee training and development is attributed to the team of Referee Supervisors who support Referee's each week in the local competitions. Their effort and support to our Referee Program sometimes goes unnoticed, I would like to thank each and everyone of the Referee Supervisors for their contribution, support and guidance to Referee's within the BACT system and pathway.



The score-table team have done an outstanding job covering games within the ACT and performance pathways. 52 participants completed the Level 1 Score-table course, which is continuously building growth within that cohort. The Score-table team were able to cover 11 WNBL Games, 43 NBL1 East Games (including finals), 15 Waratah League Games, 65% of Senior Premier League 1 Games, including additional National scrimmages or Basketball Australia camps.


Statisticians have had a big year and their dedication to the sport and their craft is applauded. The small group were able to complete 11 WNBL Games, 43 NBL East Games and 75% of Senior Premier League 1 Games in 2024, as well as supporting National camps and scrimmages at the AIS. Five new statisticians joined BACT in 2024 and we will continue to focus on growing the cohort in the coming years.

A special congratulations to Mark Harris who was selected as a reviewer/evaluator for the Paris Olympic Games in 2024.

After over 30 years of service as a statistician Bob Miller retired from officiating at the WNBL/NBL and NBL1 levels. BACT thanks and recognises Bob for his years of service to the game.



DEPARTMENT FOCUS

In 2024, Basketball ACT introduced a new campaign to help arrest the potential of abuse of referees under 18 years of age, and allow young developing referees to build their skills in a safe place.

The "Green Whistle" campaign saw referees under 18 years of age issued with green whistles and lanyards to quickly identify their age, and allow complainants to adjust their interactions accordingly.

Adopting the slogan *"If it's GREEN, Don't be MEAN. Your referee is under 18"*, the program was rolled out across Belconnen and Tuggeranong, with signage reminders displayed on each court and throughout both stadiums.

PARTICIPATION

With another big year across Basketball as a whole, Participation saw great change and fluctuation in participation numbers with the beginnings of new programs, initiatives and partnerships.

Participation saw early change with a restructure of the department, by seeing the removal of the U14s and U12s Canberra Basketball programs that now sit under the Performance Department. With this change made the newly named Participation Department has shifted its focus primarily on BACT's community programs and focusing heavily on refining inclusion in a more wholistic approach to participation of our game. Participation also gained a new member in Che Peters as a Participation Trainee to help with the delivery of programs and administration.

The development of a Participation Plan (Grow the Game Strategy) was a key focus throughout the year. This will assist with a wholistic view of community and inclusion in a strategic approach focusing on the development of Wheelchair basketball, Intellectual Disability Basketball, Female Retention/Participation and Diversity.

Ford Aussie Hoops had a fluctuation in numbers across the year. Ford Aussie Hoops had a total of 1,546 participants across 10 different locations across Canberra. With the help of the Ford partnership Basketball ACT was able to utilise new equipment used in the delivery of programs and with a new inflatable hoop and signage helped promote the program across 14 different community events and fetes.

Pink Stars, saw growth with the addition of a southside program that hit capacity in the first term. Pink stars experienced a 16.8% increase in participation. From this success, BACT will be expanding the Pink Stars program to an older cohort of participants. BACT had the pleasure of hosting the first set of She-Hoops camps across Australia. The Camp was a huge success with 162 girls participating in the camps activities and meeting basketball legend Lauren Jackson.

Sporting Schools saw decline across the country due to the new system implemented by the National Sports Commission.



BACT engaged with 20 Schools, BACT created a new Wheelchair Basketball Clinic package which provided schools 2 free trials across Term 3 and 4 to give students and schools a taster of Wheelchair Basketball before launching the program as an official clinic option for 2025.

After a successful pilot in 2023 the Indigenous Game Development Program (IGDP) grew in strength during 2024 following positive feedback from the participants and parents. IGDP ran in Term 2 (2024) with 21 participants in the program. IGDP successfully received a grant from Coolamon Advisors, to assist the program offerings and delivery model into the future. Program participants had the pleasure and opportunity to design a singlet for the Canberra Gunners and Nationals 2024 First Nations Round (see Program Highlight, right). From the program an UI6s team entered the annual Warriors NAIDOC Tournament. With the success of IGDP will continue to run and grow and will also look to grow a younger variation of the program for 2025.

Another great highlight in Participation was its new and already established Inclusion programs, with the creation of a Home School Hoops program, designed for kids that are home schooled to still be able to participate in physical activity in a team environment and have fun doing so. The All-Abilities 11-15 year old program was also established this year with 9 participants register for the first term of the program.

Walking Basketball also saw massive growth, with a 44.4% increase in participation from 2023. Basketball Australia has confirmed a Walking Basketball category in the Masters Games for 2025 which BACT will plan on entering.

BACT had the pleasure of signing a MOU agreement with The Eagles Sports Association, which is a South Sudanese association that runs a basketball program for South Sudanese peoples. With this partnership BACT will support with the resourcing for the delivery of the program and future initiatives.

With the end of another big year across the department, I would like to thank all the Participation Coaches, for always being enthusiastic, engaging coaches and for creating a welcoming environment for new participants of the sport each and every session. And very excited to see what 2025 brings with a lot of new initiatives in the works.

The Gunners and Nationals wore their uniforms during First Nations Round, when they took on Sydney Comets in 2024.

PERFORMANCE & COACHING

2024 has been a period of growth, development, and achievement for BACT's Performance Department. From expanding our foundational programs to achieving some exceptional results on the court, we've laid a strong platform for future success.

Our foundations saw Adrian Kirk join the department as Canberra Basketball Coordinator, a significant appointment that has become instrumental in managing and delivering the U12 and U14 Club Representative Programs. The Associations representative Program now form the entry point into ACT's Performance Pathway, and has a focus on:

- Foundational skill development;
- Teaching good training habits; and,

Introducing athletes to ACT's style of play.

These programs are integral to setting up young athletes for long-term success and establishing a clear link between grassroots basketball and the Performance Pathway.

BACT was able to invest in coaching support and development, with the appointment of Jontee Brown to the role of Coaching Coordinator. This new role represents a significant focus on supporting and upskilling the coaching community. Under Jontee's stewardship, BACT has implemented programs and processes to:

- Support club and representative coaches;
- Deliver coach education courses across the Territory;

• Drive alignment and consistency in coaching standards We anticipate that Jontee's leadership will lead to improved performance outcomes for players and coaches alike, ensuring we continue to raise the bar in coach development.

On the court, our representative teams demonstrated resilience, skill, and improvement throughout the 2024 performance year, with standout performances across multiple age groups and programs.

A common trait amongst our junior representative teams is a "never give up" attitude, that was prevalent in all squads. While the standard at the National Championship level is of a high quality, all of our Territory teams were able to make the step up during the tournament, and improvements were seen as the rounds played out.


